Daniel suggested to contact Larry and the Human Services Coordinator from Public Housing. Cailin to follow up with Mary at Seal. We also need to connect with Mary about the food shelf.</p>
<p>Art Fair recap and Drive 25</p>	<p>We got 65 pledges.        We will take pledges online. If someone takes a pledge, they can have a magnet. This will go out in the newsletter this month. We have people in the committee who will deliver them to people in the community.        We have a dozen signs left and we want to put some in on Territorial and at Hampden and Raymond. Wind has affected the signs.        Betty moved to have some proportionality to the sign placement so that there is a balance in north and south St. Anthony Park. There are 28 signs and we need to figure out where to place all of them. John Mark noted that we have permission from the City to put the signs in a number of places, including all gateways into the neighborhood. Brian noted that we need a list and people to put up the signs. Daniel suggested an adopt a sign program wherein members of the committee look after a sign or two.
